Fort Fisher's 149th Anniversary Program to focus on Medical Service at Fort Fisher, New Exhibit

KURE BEACH— On Saturday, January 18, 2014, Fort Fisher State Historic Site will commemorate the 149th anniversary of the Battle of Fort Fisher with the living history program, "Always near the front, with instruments and tourniquets: The Medical Service at Fort Fisher."

Held from 10 am-4 pm, this free program will focus on medical and health care available to soldiers on both sides of the 1865 battle. Civil War re-enactors will set up displays and discuss period medical tools and the care of sick and wounded soldiers. Infantry units will conduct the manual of arms and participate in firing demonstrations, as well as talk about camp life and garrison duty. Artillery units will conduct drills and firing with the site's rifled and banded 32-pound cannon and the site's bronze 12-pound Napoleon cannon. Civil War sutlers and a period photographer will be on hand and tours of the site will be conducted

throughout the day.

Ansley Wegner, author of Phantom Pain: North Carolina's Artificial Limb Program for Confederate Veterans, will talk about North Carolina's Artificial Limb program after the Civil War. Author Richard Triebe will talk about the North Carolina Troops who were captured at Fort Fisher and sent to the Prisoner of War camp in Elmira, New York and their struggles to survive. He will also be available to sign copies of his book From Fort Fisher to Elmira and Confederate Fort Fisher: A Roster 1864-1865. Also participating in the book signing will be noted Civil War author and historian

Michael Hardy. Fort Fisher State Historic Site will also be dedicating a special new exhibit called "An Eminent Work of Justice and Charity." This exhibit will contain only the third Jewett Patent Leg known to be in existence. It will also include information about caring for amputees after the war and what

was done to heal both their physical and mental wounds. All Fort Fisher programming is made possible by the Friends of Fort Fish-



er and its sustaining members: Troy and Lori Barbour, Mike McCarley, Tammy and Jack Moore, Brian and Deedra Nunnally and Iim and Catherine Taylor. 
AguaCamp - Incredible Invertebrates

Young Loggerheads Continue Their Journey

Kure Beach, NC – A hidden nest, a perilous trek, a temporary home and a Coast Guard escort makes the successful release of two loggerhead sea turtles by the North Carolina

Aquarium at Fort Fisher quite an epic tale.

The sea turtles began their journey in August 2012, when they hatched in an undiscovered dune nest in Kure Beach. Instead of heading to sea as hatchlings typically do, eleven tiny turtles took off in the wrong direction. They traveled across a busy highway, through a convenience store parking lot and into a nearby natural area. Later the same day, Aquarium staff and Pleasure Island Sea Turtle Project volunteers discovered the tiny wanderers. Several of the strays were released immediately. The Aquarium took in and cared for the remaining turtles.

Each summer, the Aquarium works with N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission and local sea turtle rescue organizations, accepting a limited number of hatchlings that do not make the initial trek to the ocean. Usually these turtles are discovered during routine nest excavations three days after a nest hatches.

While at the Aquarium, the animals received careful monitoring and care to ensure proper growth and good health. When they arrived the turtles were about the size of an Oreo cookie, but a fraction of the weight. During their stay, they grew and helped educate more than 433,000 visitors about sea turtle species, all of which are threatened or endangered.

Recently, two of the yearling turtles were cleared for release. Their growth enabled their inclusion in a satellite tracking program that began at the Aquarium in 2012. Staff named the pair, Shadow and Sassy, and affixed small battery-powered satellite transmitters to the turtles. The tracking devices allow Aquarium staff and others to gather valuable information on a released turtle's movements.

"Loggerheads spend most of their lives in the open ocean," said Aquarium Curator Hap Fatzinger. "We don't know much about them. Tracking these animals can help us learn more about their behavior."

In late November, Shadow and Sassy caught a ride with the U.S. Coast Guard on maneuvers from Fort Macon and were into the warm water of the Gulf Stream.

At the time of release, Sassy weighed approximately 9.2 pounds and measured 13.3 inches (curved length). Shadow weighed 8.8 pounds and measured 13.2 inches.

Since their release, Sassy and Shadow have traveled more than 1,534 miles and 2,269 miles, respectively. The public can follow the animals' progress and learn more about sea turtles at www.seaturtle.org.
